Yes, we know that the titles in the Junkyard Dan series are very provocative, but they get your readers to pick *up* the books! Let's not forget, your learners spend their free time playing things like *Need for Speed*, *Grand Theft Auto*, and *Call of Duty*. They are watching cool movies and cool TV shows, so they want COOL books to read. They want books they CAN read and books they CHOOSE to read. Books they are not embarrased to be seen reading!

The **JUNIXYARD DAN** series is one of our most popular series!

Readability for books 1 through 4: **Flesch-Kincaid 0.9**. Readability for books 5 through 8: **Flesch-Kincaid 1.3 to 1.4**. Readability for books 9 through 14: **Flesch-Kincaid 1.6 to 1.8**.

Please note that we prefer that the learners NOT know the reading levels of the books. All they need to know is that the books are cool, they *like* them, they can *read* them, and they are **enjoying** reading!

Your learners have most likely struggled with or failed at reading up to this point, so please do not humiliate them further by sharing the books' reading levels.




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






- Dan did a lot of this. Hint: You need a car to do it. And the word is in the first sentence of the book.

About the "freaky" punctuation:

Yes, I realize that I take a lot of poetic license with the punctuation in my books. Please understand that that is done ON PURPOSE and with a very good (and logical) reason. My books are written for the struggling, emergent and ESL reader. They are 100-page books written on a first- to second-grade reading level, so this target learnership can find immediate success and enjoyment while still being able to read them! [If your students were reading on a 4th- to 8th-grade reading level, they would not NEED books written on a 1st- to 2nd-grade reading level. They need small, concise sentences that are easy for them to read and understand.]

As with sports or playing an instrument, all the instruction and lessons are fine and dandy, but if you don't actually DO it, you will not increase your skill or fluency! Reading is exactly the same, and, unfortunately, there's not much out there for the emergent, struggling or ESL reader to read that's ON an emergent 1st- and 2nd-grade reading level. Particularly anything these readers WANT to read. :-) My **Junkyard Dan** series and my **LEADER** series address that need and are all written by me - a former inner-city educator who had a 100% success rate with NYC inner-city kids and the NY State Regents exams (which are on par with an SAT). All of my books are something these students CAN read and are something they WANT to read.

And as we all know, if you want to teach the struggling reader how to read... they actually have to READ!

When your learners are reading on age or grade level, THEN you can be more precise with them about punctuation and sentence structure; but until they are able to perform at that level, educators will only frustrate their learners and make them feel inadequate by insisting that they read on a reading level these struggling learners are not yet able to comprehend or absorb.

That is why the punctuation is as it is in some of my books. It is for the struggling learners' ultimate success.

Bottom line... my books work, and struggling readers love them! ~*Elise*

The reading levels for each series increase at a rate where the reader can't even tell. Yet, the reader WILL notice that their reading scores and fluency are increasing - but have no idea why! \bigcirc

As a fun (FREE) suggestion of something great to do with this target learner, I would like to suggest a project that was introduced to me a long time ago by Laura Brainard, a media specialist at Lakeview Middle School in Orlando, FL. She does "digital booktalks" (like movie trailers for books) with her school's struggling and ESL learners. Digital booktalks are a GREAT (FREE!) thing to do with your learners. They have to read the books, come up with a 1- to 4-minute script, do the story-boarding, use a video camera to film it, then they have to use computers to edit it, add music and titles and all sorts of OTHER fun stuff using Microsoft's Movie Maker (which most teachers don't realize comes FREE with Windows), and then they can use the computer to burn their digital booktalk to a 10-cent CD and keep it for life, and show it off to their friends! It's a great project that includes reading, writing, filming, editing, graphic art design, computer skills (both software and hardware), etc. ① And they'll not only do it willingly, they'll totally enjoy doing it! [School and learning will never have been so much fun for your struggling learners!]

I have spent my lifetime fully dedicated to breaking down barriers to reading and fostering a love for books in all individuals, regardless of their reading level or language proficiency. I sincerely thank you, from the bottom of my heart, for joining me in this exciting literary adventure!
